



Addition & Subtraction Fact Family Flashcard Game

Play 'Addition Around the World' and 'Fast Facts' or any other fun flashcard game to help your kiddos memorize their facts without it seeming like drill.

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Thank you for downloading these fun math games! I hope they help your child thoroughly memorize their basic addition and subtraction facts, but in a FUN way that doesn't feel like drill.

These flash cards are unique in that they include all three members of each fact family and will help your child thoroughly understand and memorize all of the fact families, in addition to each individual fact. This will make future math concepts easier to understand.

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Instructions:

Just print these on heavy cardstock and cut them apart on the black lines, into triangles. I laminate mine for durability. As you flash these to your child, cover up one corner with your finger and have your child say the fact as either an addition or subtraction sentence, whichever you're working on. For example, with the card below, here is the fact family:

$$6 + 4 = 10$$

$$4 + 6 = 10$$

$$10 - 6 = 4$$

$$10 - 4 = 6$$

So if you're working on addition, you would hold up the card, covering up one corner, and your child would recite either of the addition facts. To make this into a fun game, turn it into a competition. Flash the cards at two or more kids at once and the first to recite the number sentence correctly would get the card. Once all of the cards have been played, the child with the most cards wins a small prize.

It's helpful to start small for beginners. For example, just pick out and use all the nines. Or use the nines to practice skip counting by nines, and then have a competition with just the nines.

It's also helpful for beginners if you consistently cover the same corner for awhile. As they gain experience make it harder.

Once your child has these down pat, move on to the Multiplication/Division fact family cards (if you have them).

This printable also includes a page of blank cards, in case you want extra practice on a particular concept or you lose a card (though you could just come back to this file and re-print) or whatever.

Fast Facts:

Flash the cards at two or more kids at once and the first to recite the number sentence correctly gets the card. Once all of the cards have been played, the child with the most cards wins a small prize. I keep a jar of gumballs handy.

Addition Around the World Game:

This fun and exciting game is a fun way to review the addition facts.

1. Seat all players in a circle.
2. The teacher starts with two players, showing them a flashcard at the same time.
3. The player who answers first (correctly) progresses to the next player in the circle, while the other sits back down.
4. The teacher shows these two players a flashcard. The player who answers first (correctly) progresses to the next player while the other player sits back down.
5. If both players miss the answer, a new card is shown.
6. Play continues in this same way.
7. The winner is the player who gets back to his initial seat first.
8. These fact family cards work for 'Subtraction Around the World', played by the same rules, too.
